As part of the S.O.U.L. project, Ivy Women on Mission has again partnered with Cary Elementary School in Hampton. We are working with Sybil Lovett Gordon, Family Engagement Specialist at Cary on particular needs that Ivy members can assist in. Here are a few ideas to consider over the next few months:

A Night's Welcome Recap

This was our 16th year of supporting "A Nights Welcome" and we provided shelter for an average of 56 guests each night. This year we averaged approximately 18 ladies and a family of 5 each night. About 40 folks took advantage of staying in all day on Christmas Day. In addition to meals and support provided by Ivy members, outside groups provided breakfast and dinner meals including Freedom Life Church, Wesley UMC, Saint Paul's Lutheran, Team Best, and even a church in Norfolk (Pastor friend of Margaret Wilson).



There were two Christmas Cards left addressed to Ivy thanking us for our support. We even had one of our guests make a substantial offering. Often when we step out in faith, we receive the greater blessing and this was certainly the case for "A Night's Welcome" 2019.



Creating culture is one of the most significant things that we all do as human beings. We create culture in personal ways by the way we choose to live. For example, we can create a culture of hospitality or a culture of hostility in the way that we relate to other people. Each of us has a significant amount of control when it comes to the kind of culture that characterizes our life.

On a much broader scale there is the larger culture that we all live in. Our current national culture is largely a culture of crudeness, divisiveness, and lack of civility. Many of us grew up in a culture which was far more congenial, respectful, and civil. For those of us who lived in such times, these were the “good days.”

Each church also creates its own culture. Some churches may create a culture of legalism while other churches might create a culture of liberalism. Some churches create a culture that is warm and inviting while other churches create a culture that is cold and repelling.

As we look forward to entering a new decade, we will be focusing on the kind of culture that we create as a church family. Our Leadership Team will be working with us as we create a *culture of experimentation* and a *culture of conversation*. In moving forward as a church family we will need to be willing to experiment with some of our ministry areas. We do not have a hierarchical type leadership structure and culture at Ivy. Rather, we seek to create and sustain a more servant model of leadership.

The servant model seeks to encourage a culture of open and honest conversation. As we face some significant issues throughout 2020, we will seek to hear God’s Spirit as we experiment. As we move forward, we will provide opportunities to deepen and widen our conversations with each other. I look forward to the ministry experiments ahead of us and the conversations that we will share together.
